CAUTION: innovative empirical insights on flood risk governance ahead!

After 20 months, STAR-FLOOD is now reaching the end of Work Package 3 (WP3) which forms the empirical core of the project. The researchers studied flood risk governance in their country, both at the national level and at the level of three case studies in vulnerable urban regions. Besides that, all countries have held workshops at the national and the case study level to validate and disseminate their research results.
